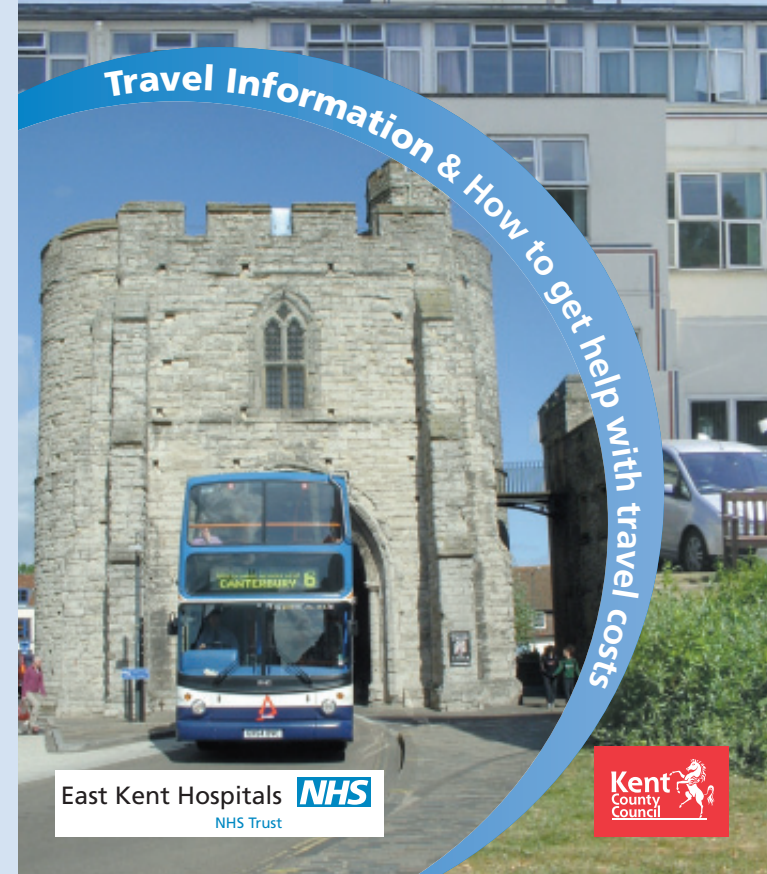


Getting to Kent & Canterbury Hospital



Hospital Travel Cost Schemes

Can't afford the fares?

You may be able to get help with the cost of travelling to hospital, or taking your child to hospital, for NHS treatment.

You qualify for help if you receive:

- Income Support
- Income Based Jobseekers Allowance
- Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit and/or Child Tax Credit

If you are on low income or get help under the national asylum support system, you also qualify. For further information and advice pick up leaflet HC11 from your hospital or call 0845 850 1166.

War pensioners have a separate scheme for claiming fares; for details ring the Veterans Helpline on 0800 169 2277.

Visitors

If you are going to hospital to visit a close relative or someone you live with you may also be eligible with help towards the cost of travelling to hospital. If you or your family get Income Support, Income based Jobseeker's Allowance, or Pension credit you can claim a Community Care Grant from your local Jobcentre Plus or Social Security office.

If you are visiting a War Pensioner who is a long-term in-patient, you could also be eligible for help towards your travel costs. For further information call the Veterans Helpline on 0800 169 2277.

How to claim

Go to the Finance Desk at the hospital. You will need to take your appointment card or letter, your tickets/receipts, and your benefit award letter, tax credit exemption certificate or certificate HC2 or HC3. You can still claim if you haven't got proof of your income, but it takes longer.

Alternative Means of Travel

Kent Karrier

Do you live in the Canterbury or Swale area and have a mobility impairment that makes travel on conventional bus and train services difficult, or live in a rural area more than 500 metres from a regular bus route? The Canterbury and Swale Kent Karrier schemes provide accessible transport from your front door to the hospital. Phone Kent County Council on 01622 605349 for more details.

Voluntary Car Schemes

Voluntary car schemes provide transport for patients and visitors who have difficulty using public transport. If you have an appointment that you cannot get to by public transport your local car scheme may be able to help.

The volunteer drivers give their time free of charge, but you will be asked to pay a mileage fee to cover their expenses, which varies slightly from scheme to scheme. Some schemes have an additional charge for administration and others have a small membership fee.

You will need to book the car scheme journey in advance, preferably 2 or 3 days, but try to give at least 24 hours notice. Remember the booking office will only be open on weekdays, not weekends.

Car Parking

Car parking at the hospital is limited, so please use public transport if you can. Both patient and visitor parking is pay and display.

Park and Ride services run to the bus station from Wincheap, Sturry Road and Old Dover Road. From the bus station you can catch service 25 to the hospital.

Appointments to Suit You

Perhaps you use public transport and cannot get to the hospital for an early appointment, or you have to take children to school before you leave home. When you arrange your appointment, please remember that you can ask for a time that suits you. If you think you are going to find it difficult to get to the hospital for the appointment time you have been offered, you can ask for an alternative time.

If you cannot attend your appointment please tell the hospital immediately by calling the patients call centre on 0845 084 0500.

Public Transport to Kent and Canterbury Hospital

Travelling to Kent and Canterbury Hospital is easy by bus and train. The bus departs from Bay A3 of the bus station and runs a regular service to the hospital. Service 25 follows this route every 20 minutes, Monday to Saturday and Service 25A runs every hour on Sundays and evenings.



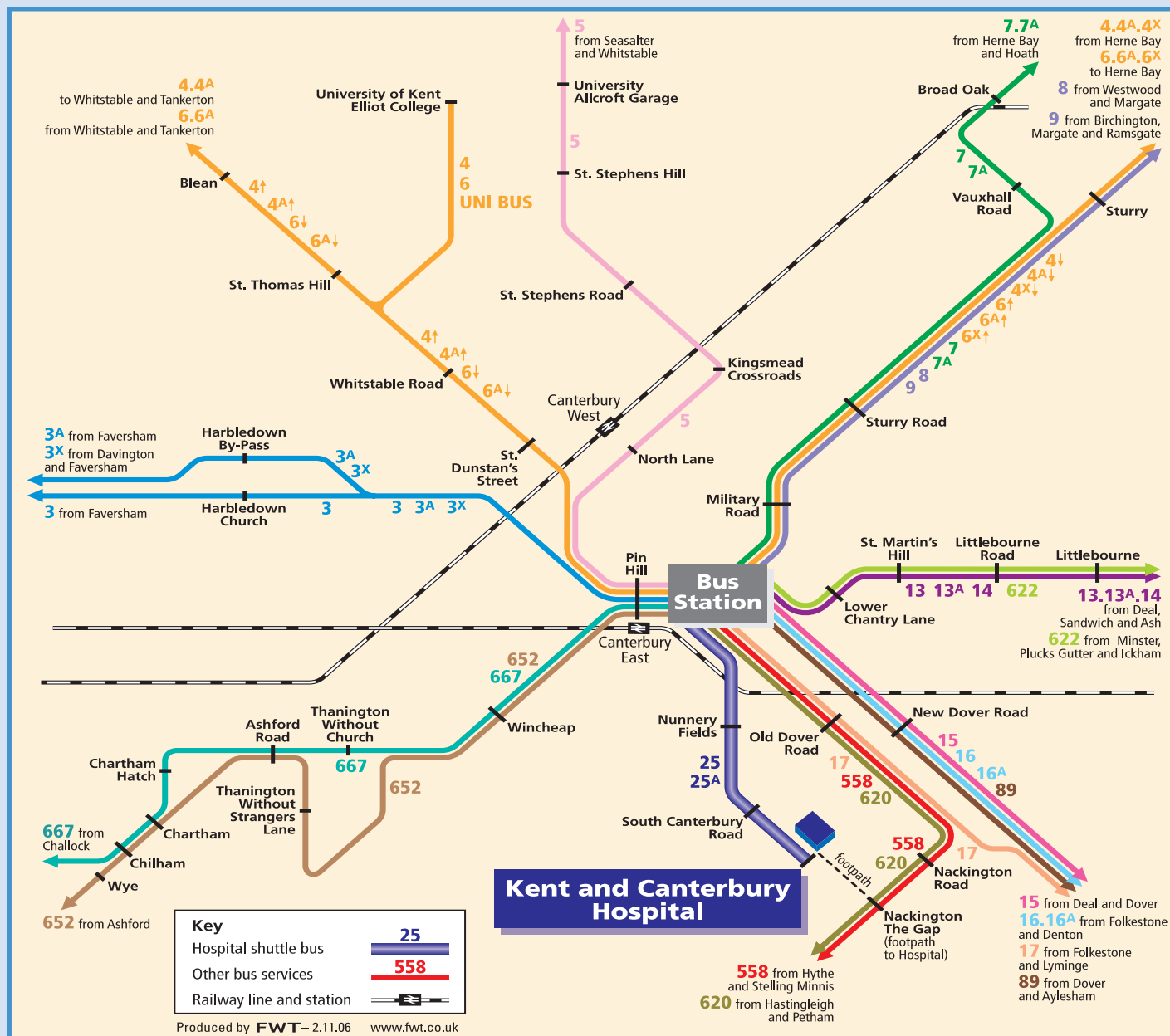
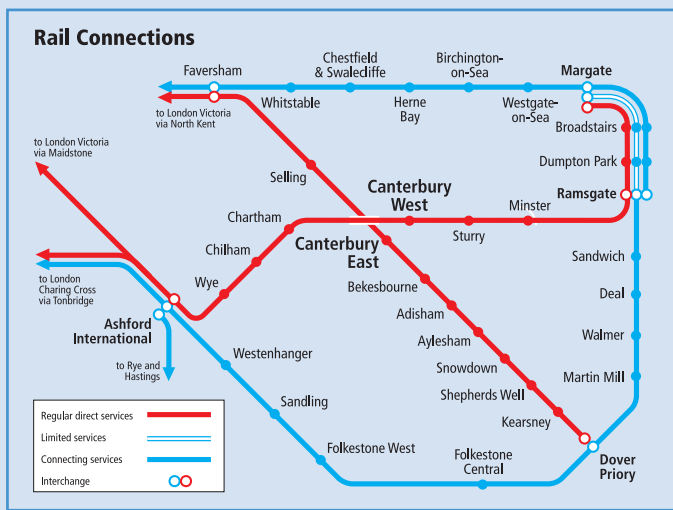
By Bus

If travelling by bus, remember a day ticket or a return ticket may cost less. Ask the driver which is the best ticket option for you. Concessionary bus passes are accepted on all services from 0930, Monday to Friday, and all day Saturday and Sunday.



By Rail

If you are travelling by train, the closest station is Canterbury East which is a short walk to the bus station. Canterbury West is further, although several bus services run from here to the bus station. From the bus station, you can catch service 25 or 25A.



Rail & Bus Tickets

If you have a direct link to a Canterbury station, it may be quicker to travel by train and then bus. The bus station is a short journey from either station and service 25 runs frequently from here. You can buy a combined rail and bus ticket for this journey. Ask for PlusBus when you buy your rail ticket.
